Detective Norris Stensland: The Human Bloodhound

Norris Stensland was a member of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department from the early 1920s until his retirement in 1951. During those three decades, he worked on many of the most sensational crimes in county history. The bespectacled lawman's unassuming appearance may have lulled many a felon into a false sense of security, but he didn't earn the nicknames "The Human Bloodhound" and "Little Satan" for nothing. Join writer and historian, **Joan Renner**, as she explores the life and work of legendary lawman, Norris Stensland.



Joan Renner has a great interest in historic Los Angeles crime. She has appeared on the **TCM** channel in a segment on film noir, and in episodes of the **Investigation Discovery** channel's series: *Deadly Women*, *Deadly Affairs*, *Evil Twins*, *Nightmare Next Door* and *Dark Temptations*.
